During the year under review, the Company achieved gross income of **Rs. 714.67 Lacs** against **Rs. 835.18 Lacs** in the previous year, resulting into fall in the income by over **14.43**% in comparison to previous year.

The Company has operational loss of **Rs. 107.62 Lacs** for the year under review as against operational income of **Rs. 50.07 Lacs** of the previous year, resulting into substantial decrease by over 314.93 % as compared to previous year.



The Company has earned a net loss of **Rs. 99.09 Lacs** for the year under review as against profit of **Rs. 15.67 Lacs** of the previous year, resulting into substantial decrease by over 732.35% in comparison to previous year. The Board is hopeful of achieving better performance in coming years considering the future prospects.

6. <u>Material changes and commitments, if any, affecting the financial position of the company which have occurred between the end of the financial year of the company to which the financial statements relate and the date of the report</u>

There are no material changes occurred subsequent to the close of the financial year of the Company to which the balance sheet relates and the date of the report.

7. <u>Details of significant and material orders passed by the regulators or courts or tribunals impacting the going concern status and company's operations in future</u>

There is no information to be offered under this heading.

8. <u>Details in respect of adequacy of internal financial controls with reference to the</u> Financial Statements.

The Company has sound internal financial controls commensurate to the size and nature of its business. The Company periodically reviews the internal financial controls in the light of new statues, changes in business models, adoption of new technology solutions and suggestions for improvements received from employees.

12. Statutory Auditors

M/s. CNK & Associates LLP, Chartered Accountants firm Reg. no. 101961W/W-100036 were appointed as Statutory Auditors of the company at the 22nd Annual General meeting held on 24th September, 2018 to hold office till the conclusion of 27th Annual General Meeting.

Auditors of the Company M/s CNK & Associates LLP, Chartered Accountants firm Reg. no. 101961W/W-100036 hold office until the conclusion of the ensuing Annual General Meeting and being eligible offer themselves for re-appointment until the conclusion of 30th Annual General Meeting of the company to be held in the Year 2026.

As required under the provisions of section 139(1) of the Companies Act, 2013, the company has received a written consent from M/s CNK & Associates LLP, Chartered Accountants firm Reg. no. 101961W/W-100036 to their re-appointment and a certificate, to the effect that their re-appointment, if made, would be in accordance with the new Act and the Rules framed there under and that they satisfy the criteria provided in Section 141 of the Companies Act, 2013.

Gandhi (holding DIN: 00977474) will retire by rotation at the ensuing Annual General Meeting (AGM) of your Company and being eligible, offers himself for re-election. Your Board recommends his re-election.

C) Declaration by an Independent Director(s) and re- appointment, if any

A declaration by an Independent Director(s) that he/they meet the criteria of independence as provided in sub-section (6) of Section 149 of the Companies Act, 2013, is not applicable to the Company.

20. Audit Committee

The Company does not fall under the purview of the provisions **Section 177** of the Companies Act, 2013 and **Rule 6 and 7** of Companies (Meetings of Board and its Powers) Rules, 2014, which becomes effective from 1st April, 2014.

21. Details of establishment of vigil mechanism for directors and employees

The provision of Section 177 (9) of the Companies Act, 2013 mandates the following classes of Companies to constitute a vigil mechanism:

To the members of Express Resorts and Hotels Limited

Report on the audit of the Standalone Financial Statements

Opinion

Notes forming part of the Standalone Financial Statements

NOTE NO.1: CORPORATE INFORMATION

The Company was incorporated in 1996. The Company is engaged in the following activities:

- (a) Hotel room services;
- (b) Restaurant services;
- (c) Banquet hall services;

NOTENO.2: SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES

2.1 Basis of accounting and preparation of financial statements:

These financial statements are prepared in accordance with Indian Generally Accepted Accounting Principles (GAAP) under the historical cost convention on the accrual basis. GAAP comprises mandatory accounting standards as prescribed under Section 133 of the Companies Act, 2013 ('Act') read with Companies (Accounting Standards) Rules, 2021, and the provisions of the Act.The Company is a Small and Medium Sized Company as defined in the General Instructions in respect of Accounting Standards as prescribed under the Companies (Accounting Standards) Rules, 2021. Accordingly, the Company has complied with the Accounting Standards as applicable to a Small and Medium Sized Company. The accounting policies adopted in the preparation of the financial statements are consistent with those followed in the previous year.

The Company has ascertained its operating cycle as 12 months for the purpose of current/non-current classification of assets and liabilities. This is based on the nature of products and the time between acquisition of assets for processing and their realization in cash and cash equivalents.

2.2 Use of estimates:

The preparation of the financial statements in conformity with Indian GAAP requires the management to make estimates and assumptions considered in the reported amounts of assets and liabilities (including contingent liabilities) and the reported income and expenses during the year. The management believes that the estimates used in preparation of the financial statements are prudent and reasonable. Future results could differ due to these estimates and the differences between the actual results and the estimates are recognized in the periods in which the results are known / materialize.

2.3 Inventories:

Inventories are valued at the lower of cost and estimated net realizable value after providing for obsolescence, if any. Cost is determined using FIFO method.

The cost of inventories comprises cost of purchase and other incidental costs incurred in bringing the inventories to their present location and condition.

2.4 Property, Plant & Equipment:

(i)Tangible assets:

Property, plant and equipment are stated at cost, less accumulated depreciation and impairment, if any. Costs directly attributable to acquisition are capitalized until the Property, plant and equipment are ready for use, as intended by management. Borrowing cost relating to acquisition of Property Plant and equipment which takes substantial period of time to get ready for its intended use are also included to the extent they relate to the period till such assets ready to be put to use.

Subsequent expenditures relating to property, plant and equipment is capitalized only when it is probable that future economic benefits associated with these will flow to the company and the cost of the item can be measured reliably. Repairs and maintenance costs are recognized in net profit in the statement of profit and loss when incurred. The cost and related accumulated depreciation are eliminated from the financial

statements upon sale or retirement of the asset and the resultant gains or losses are recognized in the statement of profit and loss. Assets to be disposed off are reported at the lower of the carrying value or the fair value less cost to sell.

The Company depreciates property, plant and equipment over their estimated useful lives using the straight-line method. In case the cost of part of assets is significant to total cost of assets and useful life of that part is different from the useful life of the remaining assets, the useful life of the significant part has been determined separately. The estimated useful lives of assets are as follows:

Plant and Machinery

5 - 15 years

Based on technical evaluation, the management believes that the useful lives as given above best represent the period over which management expects to use these assets. Hence, the useful life for these assets is different from the useful lives as prescribed under Part C of Schedule II of the Companies Act 2013.

Depreciation methods, useful lives and residual values are reviewed periodically, including at each financial year end.

Advances paid towards the acquisition of property, plant and equipment outstanding at each balance sheet date is classified as capital advances under "Long Term Loans and advances" and the cost of assets not put to use before such date are disclosed under 'Capital work-in-progress'.

(ii) Capital work-in-progress:

Capital work-in-progress is carried at cost, comprising direct cost, related incidental expenses.

2.5 Intangible assets:

Intangible assets are carried at cost less accumulated amortization and impairment losses, if any. The cost of an intangible asset comprises its purchase price and any directly attributable expenditure on making the asset ready for its intended use.

Intangible assets are amortized over their respective individual estimated useful lives not exceeding 10 years on a straight-line basis

2.6 Revenue recognition:

Rooms, Restaurants, Banquets and Other related services:

Rooms, Restaurants, Banquets and Other Services comprise of sale of rooms, food and beverages, allied services relating to hotel operations. Revenue is generally recognized on accrual basis upon rendering of the services, except in case of significant uncertainties.

2.7 Other income:

(i) Interest income:

Interest income is accounted on accrual basis.

(ii) Dividend income:

Dividend Income is accounted for when the right to receive it is established.

2.8 Foreign currency transactions and translations:

(i) Initial recognition:

Transactions in foreign currencies entered into by the Company are accounted at the exchange rates prevailing on the date of the transaction or at rates that closely approximate the rate at the date of the

transaction.

(ii) Measurement of foreign currency monetary items at the Balance Sheet date:

'Foreign currency monetary items of the Company outstanding at the Balance Sheet date are restated at the year-end rates. Exchange differences arising out of these are charged to the Statement of Profit and Loss.

(iii) Treatment of exchange differences:

Exchange differences arising on settlement / restatement of short-term foreign currency monetary assets and liabilities of the Company are recognized as income or expense in the Statement of Profit and Loss.

2.9 Investments:

Long-term investments are carried individually at cost less provision for diminution, other than temporary, in the value of such investments.

Current investments are carried individually, at the lower of cost and fair value.

2.10 Employee benefits:

Employee benefits include provident fund, superannuation fund, gratuity fund, compensated absences.

(i) Defined contribution plans:

The Company's makes contribution to provident fund to Employees Provident Fund Organization (managed by Government) and charged the same as an expense as they fall due based on the amount of contribution required to be made.

(ii) Defined benefit plans:

For defined benefit plans in the form of gratuity fund, the cost of providing benefits is determined using the Projected Unit Credit method, with actuarial valuations being carried out at each Balance Sheet date. Actuarial gains and losses are recognised in the Statement of Profit and Loss in the period in which they occur. Past service cost is recognized immediately to the extent that the benefits are already vested. The retirement benefit obligation recognized in the Balance Sheet represents the present value of the defined benefit obligation as adjusted for unrecognized past service cost, as reduced by the fair value of scheme assets.

(iii) Short-term employee benefits:

The undiscounted amount of short-term employee benefits expected to be paid in exchange for the services rendered by employees are recognized during the year when the employees render the service. These benefits include performance incentive and compensated absences which are expected to occur within twelve months after the end of the period in which the employee renders the related service.

2.11 Earnings per share:

Basic earnings per share is computed by dividing the profit / (loss) after tax by the weighted average number of equity shares outstanding during the year.

2.12 Taxes on income:

Current tax is the amount of tax payable on the taxable income for the year as determined in accordance with the provisions of the Income Tax Act, 1961.

Deferred tax is recognized on timing differences, being the differences between the taxable income and the accounting income that originate in one period and are capable of reversal in one or more subsequent periods. Deferred tax is measured using the tax rates and the tax laws enacted or substantially enacted as at the reporting date. Deferred tax liabilities are recognized for all timing differences. Deferred tax assets are recognized for timing differences of other items based on future sales projection of the company. Deferred tax assets and liabilities are offset if such items relate to taxes on income levied by the same governing tax laws and the Company has a legally enforceable right for such set off. Deferred tax assets are reviewed at each Balance Sheet date for their realisability.

2.13 Provisions and contingencies:

A provision is recognized when the Company has a present obligation as a result of past events and it is probable that an outflow of resources will be required to settle the obligation in respect of which a reliable estimate can be made. Provisions (excluding retirement benefits) are not discounted to their present value and are determined based on the best estimate required to settle the obligation at the Balance Sheet date. These are reviewed at each Balance Sheet date and adjusted to reflect the current best estimates. Contingent liabilities are disclosed in Notes to the Financial Statements.

2.14 Cash and Cash Equivalents:

Cash and cash equivalents for the purposes of the cash flow statement comprise cash at bank and in hand and short-term investments with an original maturity of three months or less.

2.15 Cash Flow Statement:

Cash flows are reported using the Indirect Method, where by net profit before tax is adjusted for the effects of transactions of a non-cash nature, any deferrals or accruals of past or future operating cash receipts or payments and item of income or expenses associated with investing or financing cash flows. The cash flows from operating, investing and financing activities are segregated.
